

# Townie Pattern

## Austin's Famous Furry Friend

Hook: H

Yarn: Lion Brand Wool-Ease worsted weight  
(80% acrylic, 20% wool; 85 gms., 197 yds.)  
1 skein ea.:

Color A: Mushroom Heather (86% acrylic,  
10% wool, 4% rayon)

Color B: Chocolate Brown

Notions: Stuffing (i.e. yarn scraps),  
½ in. button (optional)

Gauge: 1" x 1" 5 sts, 6 rows

\*\*Gauge is not terribly important  
for this project. Stitches should be tight.



### Body

Color A:

Start from tail, working up body.

1. Ch 3, join, Ch 1
2. 2 sc in ea. sc around, join, Ch 1 (6 sts.)
3. Repeat Row 2 (12 sts.)
4. \*1 sc in each sc around, join, Ch 1\* 8 times
5. Row with "snout": 1 sc in next 3 sts; 1 **puff st** in next st: yo, insert hook in next sc, yo and draw up loop, yo and draw through 2 loops; \*yo, draw up a loop in same st, yo and through 2 loops; repeat from \* once more, yo and through all 4 loops on hook, ch 1; 1 sc in next 8 sc around, join, Ch 1
6. \*1 sc in ea. sc (and top of puff st) around, join, Ch 1\* 11 times

Do not break yarn. With Color B and a yarn needle, make knots for eyes and sew a couple of stitches on snout for nose. Knot and hide ends inside body. Stuff body.

7. \*1 sc in next sc, skip next sc\* repeat around, 1 sc in next sc, join, Ch 1
8. Break yarn, leaving 10 inch tail.
9. Pull yarn through ch on hook, creating a knot. With a yarn needle, sew opening flat across head. Weave in end.

### Ears

Color A:

Make sure to leave enough yarn at beginning and end, b/c you'll use these ends to sew on ears to body.

1. Ch 4

2. 1 sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, 1 sc in next 2 sc. Tie off.

Position one ear on side of head; sew in ear in place with yarn tails. Tie ends tog in a sq. knot in between sts; hide knot inside body. Weave in ends. Sew on other ear.

Make 2. Optional: Make ears in Color B instead.

## Wings

Color B:

Each wing is a set of sides 1 and 2. Pieces are worked from top of wing, down.

Side 1:

1. Ch 2
2. 1 sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, turn
3. 3 sc in 1<sup>st</sup> sc, ch 1, turn
4. \*1 sc in each sc, ch 1, turn\* 3 times
5. 2 sc in 1<sup>st</sup> sc, 1 sc in next 2 sc, ch 1, turn
6. 1 sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc, ch 1, turn
7. 2 sc in 1<sup>st</sup> sc, 1 sc in next 4 sc, ch 1, turn
8. 1 sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc, ch 2, turn
9. 1 dc in 1<sup>st</sup> sc, 1 sc in next 5 sc, 1 dc in next sc, ch 2, turn
10. 1 dc in 1<sup>st</sup> sc, 1 sc in next 5 sc, 1 dc in next sc. Tie off.

Side 2:

1. Repeat Rows 1-4 from above.
2. 1 sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, ch 1, turn
3. 2 sc in next sc, 1 sc in next 3 sc, ch 1, turn
4. 1 sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc, ch 1, turn
5. 2 sc in next sc, 1 sc in next 5 sc, ch 2, turn
6. Repeat Rows 9-10 from above.

Make 2 sets.

With one set, line up from top to bottom, the two shorter sides of the "triangles." Sandwich the two pieces tog, fronts facing ea. other. With matching yarn, sew along the edges. Weave in ends.

Repeat with 2<sup>nd</sup> set.

Sew wings to body:

Figure out positioning of wings. Overlap the ends on the back. Sew securely so they don't flop around too much but are still movable.

## Optional

Sew button on back of bat. Now Townie can fit into your sweater's buttonhole or onto any loosely knit or crocheted garment! **OR** Crochet a chain any desired length, attach to back and there you have it – Cat toy!
